ISIN Code is the code of international securities. <u>The Association of National Numbering Agencies</u> (ANNA) has issued and constructed the ISIN Code.

For Thailand, Thailand Securities Depository Ltd, Co. (TSD) a member of ANNA has issued Thai ISIN Code according to the standard ISO 6166 for every type of securities both registered and non-registered securities. Thai ISIN code consists of a total of 12 characters as followings.

## Part C: Checking DIGIT (1 digit) Part B: Basic Number (9 digits) Part A: Prefix (2 digits)

**Part A: Prefix** – the first two characters are taken up by the alpha-2 country code as issued in accordance with the international standard ISO 3166 of the country where the issuer is registered e.g. TH = Thailand

**Part B: Basic Number** - the next nine characters are taken up by the local number of the security concerned.

Part B- 1 The first group of 4 characters is the code of company assigned by TSD e.g. 0001, 0002, 0003

Part B-2 The second group of 2 characters is a type of securities

e.g. 01 = common stock, unit trust 02 = preferred stock

07 = short-term debenture 08 = derivative warrant

10 transferable subscription rights 99 = Thai Baht currency
